

DESCRIPTION

The Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI) is a core element of the Navy's Information Warfare Community whose goal is to gain and hold a decisive information advantage over America's potential adversaries. ONI collects, analyzes, and produces maritime intelligence and disseminates that intelligence rapidly to strategic, operational, and tactical decision makers to meet Navy, Department of Defense (DoD), and national requirements. Their integrated workforce of active duty and reserve naval and civilian professionals supports combat operations and provides vital information for planning America's defense against maritime threats at home and around the world. The office produces maritime intelligence on naval weapons and technology proliferation, transnational threats in civil maritime counter-proliferation, counter-narcotics and the global maritime environment, and other activities that directly support the U.S. Navy, joint war fighters, and national decision makers and agencies

ONI is America's premier maritime intelligence service and a core element of the U.S. Navy's Information Warfare Community. ONI possesses unmatched knowledge of the maritime operating environment and delivers penetrating understanding of threats to America's security to national decision makers and the

Under the leadership of the Commander, Office of Naval Intelligence (COMONI), who also acts as the Director, National Maritime Intelligence-Integration Office (NMIO), ONI collects, analyzes and produces maritime intelligence and disseminates that intelligence rapidly to strategic, operational, and tactical decision makers to meet Navy, DoD, and national requirements.

ONI provides:

- Over 3,000 active duty and reserve naval and civilian professionals that provide surveillance of the global maritime environment, with technical, operational, and tactical support to the U.S. Navy and its partners. Their personnel support combat operations and provide vital information for planning America's defense against maritime threats at home and around the world.
- · Real-time reporting on the developments and activities of foreign navies, including maritime intelligence on naval weapons and technology proliferation.
- Maritime resource and interest protection that identifies transnational threats in civil maritime counter-

ORGANIZATION

ONI has the following Centers of Excellence (CoE) that are distinct commands:

- Nimitz Warfare Analysis Center is the U.S. Navy's pre-eminent CoE for operational and strategic analysis of events associated with the maritime domain. The center supports fleet commanders and national policymakers, and provides timely and relevant analysis tailored to meet customer
- Farragut Technical Analysis Center is the U.S. Navy's CoE for strategic scientific and technical intelligence (S&TI) analysis of foreign technologies, sensors, weapons, platforms, combat systems, C4ISR, and cyber capabilities. In addition to its all-source capabilities, Farragut conducts ONI's foreign materiel exploitation and signal analysis, and is home to the National Acoustic Intelligence Laboratory (NAIL)
- Kennedy Maritime Analysis Center is the Navy's CoE for civil maritime, counternarcotics, and adversary malign influence activities expertise. Kennedy's expertise informs policy and plans at the strategic level while integrating at the operational and tactical levels in support of day-to-day competition while remaining "at the ready as ONI's action arm" for crisis and/or conflict. The center integrates extensive maritime industry expertise, proven operational intelligence experience, and innovative analytical tools and techniques to provide National, Navy, and Partner/Allies decision-makers a decisive advantage
- · Hopper Global Communications Center provides information services that support global maritime and intelligence operations
- · Brooks Center for Maritime Engagement assimilates subject matter expertise with publicly available information to address strategic priorities concerning security threats to our global maritime environment. Brooks liaises and partners with the maritime community, enhancing ONI production and fostering decision advantage for U.S. Navy leadership.
